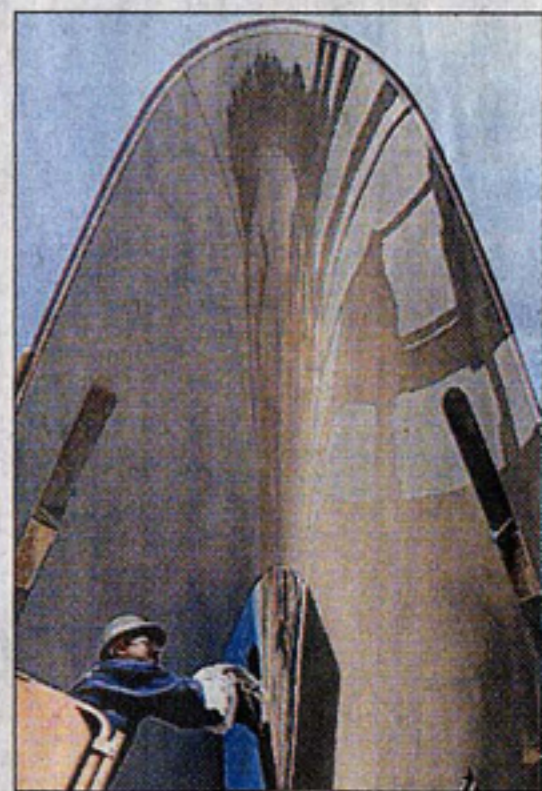
Launch of a super-yacht

Destination FOXHARB'R Too was launched at Trinity Yachts on Tuesday, with an audience that included Trinity officials and workers, and owner Ron Joyce of Calgary, Alberta, Canada.

The 161-foot super-yacht, whose price tag is between \$30 million and \$50 million, is the seventh yacht launched in Gulfport since Trinity moved its operation from New Orleans to Gulfport in September 2005. An estimated 400,000 hours will have gone into the construction of the yacht, which required a total of two years to complete. The yacht will go through sea trial, and the final interior work will be completed in about two months.

Trinity bills itself as the largest super-yacht manufacturer in the country, with 650 workers and 19 yachts currently under contract at its yards in Gulfport and New Orleans.
